






We continued to compile data on the movement of West Coast Crude Oil.

• Track crude movement by rail, pipeline, vessel, and barge.


Map of facilities, refineries, and terminals (updated annually).

West Coast Oil Spill Data



We paused to reflect on the West Coast Oil Spill dataset.

- This has been a significant lift by jurisdictions to compile 20 years of shared data.
- Further work is needed to understand who is using this and how it should be shared in future years.



Sharing information

- Task Force Members continue to meet regularly.
- We have a listserv of approx. 1,500 partners.
- We provide biweekly news clippings on regional and international oil spill news.









- Our Drills and Exercises Workgroup meets quarterly
- We exercise the Task Force Mutual Aid Agreement (every other year)
- Members participate in local and regional planning exercises and Regional Response Teams (RRTs)

Action on Priority Issues

- We wrapped up 5year focus on Abandoned and Derelict Vessels (ADVs)
- Ensure that all jurisdictions have the funding resources they need.
